

RESOLUTION 89-1

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FRIEND, SALINE COUNTY, NEBRASKA DETERMINING THAT CONGESTION AND DANGER TO THE PEDESTRIANS AND THE TRAVELING PUBLIC IN AND AROUND THE AREA OF THE FRIEND PUBLIC SCHOOLS EXISTS, BY REASON OF ALLOWING PARKING ON THE EAST SIDE OF MAIN STREET AND ON THE NORTH SIDE OF FIFTH STREET AT ITS INTERSECTION WITH MAIN STREET, THE AREA WHERE TWO HOUR PARKING HAS PREVIOUSLY BEEN PERMITTED BETWEEN 9:00 O'CLOCK A.M. AND 5:00 O'CLOCK P.M. IT IS NOW DETERMINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL TO BE A CLEAR AND PRESENT DANGER TO THE PEDESTRIANS AND TRAVELING PUBLIC, AND ALL PARKING SHALL NOW BE ABSOLUTELY PROHIBITED.

IT IS THEREFORE RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FRIEND that the area on the east side of Main Street between it's intersection with Fifth Street, Sixth Street, and the Street between the Friend Public Schools and St. Joseph's Catholic Church property, where two hour parking was allowed between 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M., shall now be absolutely prohibited for any period of time during all hours. Furthermore, no parking at all shall be allowed on the north side of Fifth Street from its intersection with Main Street and 150 feet east thereof. The placement of No Parking signs is hereby authorized and the violation thereof is hereby declared unlawful and punishable as are other traffic infractions and other violations of City Ordinances of the City of Friend.

This Resolution offered on this 3rd day of January, 1989, by Councilman Ross and seconded by Councilman Nelson. All Councilmen voting aye, the Resolution was passed and ordered and the City Clerk is authorized to notify all property owners affected by this change in parking, residing on the abutting streets.


